
YOUNG COLLECTORS' WEEKEND



Young Collectors' Weekend (YCW) is a platform for the various stakeholders in the South Asian art ecosystem. The goal of YCW is to bring together India's most talented contemporary artists with the next generation of collectors, and to facilitate relationships that will mature together. We aim to broaden the audience for contemporary art, enhance opportunities for artists and establish continuous dialogues. YCW is anchored by group shows in cities across India. Each exhibition is a weekend-long engagement between artists and the world around them.

Each artist selected for the shows has shown a consciousness in their practice, and a determination to use their art to express themselves, as well as universal humanistic themes that we, as a society can all relate to. They go beyond aesthetics to create work with their own unique vocabulary that resonates deeply with and inspires a diverse audience.

This year the unifying theme that underlines the shows is the word **flux**. The art world is constantly evolving and changing, in response to and as a representation of how the world at large is constantly transforming. Each artist showcased at YCW for the year 2023 has shown through their practice an adaptation of an ever-dynamic world.

This year, YCW will expand its programming outside its flagship New Delhi event to Mumbai and beyond.

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RICHAARYA

Richa Arya's rich body of work embodies the feminist spirit of "personal is political". Resolutely South Asian, and easily accessible, her visual language is a powerful articulation of countless interlinked tropes of patriarchal oppression which otherwise remain unaccounted for.

She sculpts everyday objects using stereotypically 'feminine 'skills like stitching to highlight the lives of common women, hinting at their hardships by using rusted metal sheets.







HARISHA CHENNANGOD

HARSHA DURUGADDA

Harsha Durugadda explores visual language on a metalevel in his sculptures, which draw reference to human behaviour as a form of protest.

Through participation, he invites the sensation of the piece to question the viewer's perception. Sometimes there are no recognisable forms in his creations. The results are so thoroughly dissected that the meaning is altered and there are many other ways to interpret them.




MONICA GHULE





What does it mean when an archaic goddess who once protected humans, now, rebirths inside an imaginary botanical womb while giving birth to a tree?





SHIVANGI LADHA


Shivangi Ladha's work questions the identity of our beloved human race. She uses a self- referential process to channel her engagement with social, political, and ecological spaces through the human body.

Her prints represent the collective voice of a crowd – a crowd seeking to rise and transcend to a place or state where there is no differentiation between gender, sexuality, race, caste, creed, disability, and class, where we are essentially all one and the same from within.





The space divisions are delineated through the brick walled architectural divisions that she often come across in the city of Baroda where she lives.






Forest of despair III

AL-QAWI NANAVATI



The process of crafting these letters resulted in secret scripts and repurposing pieces of her mother's clothing, photographs, found objects that remind her of her mother etc.









HARISH OJHA

Harish Ojha primarily uses paper in his works, through which he expresses the magic of life being created from earth. He uses paper with high cotton content since it is flexible, he tears the thin upper layer of the surface, rolls and plants it in a predesigned arrangement to the support.

The resonance between his inspiration and process and the traditions of the earth go further. The dots and swirls in work mimic the imagery of indigenous painting traditions like gond art while their repetitive process of creation emerges from the time consuming and continuous nature of agriculture.



Distilled into an abstract visual language consisting of circles and elliptical patterns, Rai alludes and (re-)presents the precariousness of existing on the margins.








Untitled Mixed Media 21 X 20.5 inches INR 2,00,000


AVANI RAI




As a photographer she has contributed to the Sunday Guardian, Scroll, The Wire and is currently spends most her time in Kashmir documenting this politically complicated region and its people.




Wildflower Edition of 10 20 X 30 inches INR 1,54,000
