Young Collectors' Weekend (YCW) is a platform for the various stakeholders in the South Asian art ecosystem. The goal of YCW is to bring together India's most talented contemporary artists with the next generation of collectors, and to facilitate relationships that will mature together. We aim to broaden the audience for contemporary art, enhance opportunities for artists and establish continuous dialogues. YCW is anchored by group shows in cities across India. Each exhibition is a weekend-long engagement between artists and the world around them.

Each artist selected for the shows has shown a consciousness in their practice, and a determination to use their art to express themselves, as well as universal humanistic themes that we, as a society can all relate to. They go beyond aesthetics to create work with their own unique vocabulary that resonates deeply with and inspires a diverse audience.

This year the unifying theme that underlines the shows is the word **flux**. The art world is constantly evolving and changing, in response to and as a representation of how the world at large is constantly transforming. Each artist showcased at YCW for the year 2023 has shown through their practice an adaptation of an ever-dynamic world.

This year, YCW will expand its programming outside its flagship New Delhi event to Mumbai and beyond.





Akshita's works are investigative pieces that revolve around duality, construction and deconstruction of identity that oscillates between reality and fantasy.



What of the stories of scarless wounds?







MEGHANA GAVIREDDYGARI







LAXMIPRIYA PANIGRAHI




Koyal's figure drawings invite reflection on the body in relation to time, perfection and the mechanical state of being.






DIVYA SINGH


TITO STANLEY




Birender's works are a means to reconcile with the conflicting realities constructed by the power structures on one hand and the struggle ridden everyday life of the most oppressed on the other.

He tries to incorporate the realities of the everyday life struggles with losing much through representation.




Transient lanscape 1
